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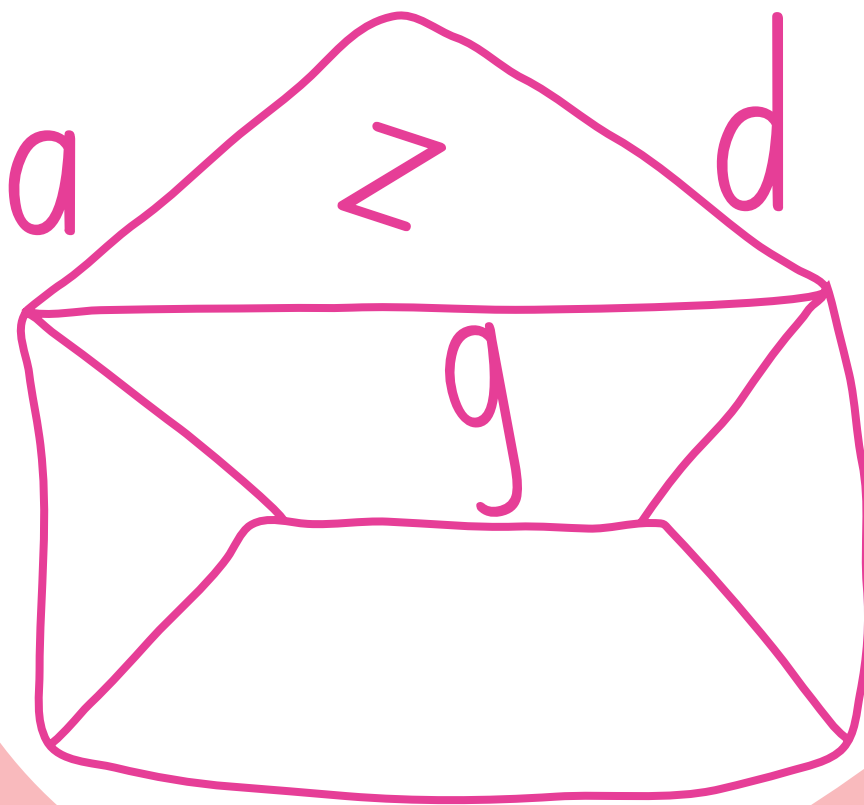



5 - Letters On Envelopes 	<p>Collect the mail with the child and talk about the letters on the envelope. Ask the child to find all the letters on the envelope that have a straight line. Help the child to find all the letters on the envelope that have a circle or oval shape.</p>	<p>Ask the child to choose somebody to send this eWorksheet to. Address the envelope with the child and post it.</p>
6 - Spot The Letters 	<p>Go on a letter hunt while out shopping. Give the child a letter to hold and ask the child to find that letter. Encourage the child to look at signs and packaging that he/she may be familiar with.</p>	<p>Play hide-and-seek with letters hidden around the house. Initially, ask the child to look for any letter. Later, increase the difficulty by asking the child to find a specific letter.</p>
7 - Letters On Street Signs 	<p>Take a walk with the child and look at surrounding street name signs. Ask the child to look at street name signs and count the letters in each sign.</p>	<p>Talk about the letters in the name of your street. Write your street name on a piece of cardboard for the child to decorate and add string for hanging. Hang the child's street name somewhere on the house.</p>
8 - Letters On A Shopping List 	<p>Play a memory game with the child using six items from the food cupboard. Place the items in a shopping bag and say "Look in my shopping bag." Ask the child to look away and remove an item from the bag. Let the child look in the bag and ask "What's missing from my shopping bag?" Make the game more challenging by removing two and then three items from the bag.</p>	<p>Write a real shopping list with the child. Let the child observe while you list some items. Ask the child to add something to the list. The child can draw a picture, or write some letters, for the item being listed. Give the child control of the shopping list when out shopping.</p>

1 - Numbers On The Phone 	<p>Look at a real phone and talk about the numbers.</p> <p>Let the child choose which numbers to write on the eWorksheet and accept the child's choice. It does not need to match a conventional phone.</p>	<p>Make a phone call and ask the child to press the numbers.</p> <p>Make a list of telephone numbers relevant to the child e.g. grandma's, pre-school's, neighbour's and police.</p>
2 - Numbers On The Letterbox 	<p>Walk outside and look at surrounding letterboxes.</p> <p>Copy the numbers on your letterbox and try to find these on other letterboxes.</p>	<p>Write a letter to send to someone. Draw attention to the postcode, date, number of the house etc.</p>
3 - Match the Patterns 	<p>Use body percussion to make a pattern e.g. clap, stamp, clap, stamp. Ask the child to copy the pattern.</p>	<p>Use chalk to draw large numbers on a footpath. Ask the child to fill the numbers with patterns.</p>
4 - Numbers On Buses 	<p>Talk about the purpose of numbers on a bus. Whilst out walking or driving, draw the child's attention to the numbers on the bus.</p>	<p>Use a tissue box to make a bus. Cut out some windows and give the bus a number.</p>

Talk about the similarities and differences between cars and aeroplanes.</p>	<p>Provide empty cardboard boxes and rolls and ask the child to make an aeroplane. Talk about the shapes in the child's aeroplane.</p>
<p>2 - My Fluffy Sheep</p> 	<p>Sing a song about sheep e.g. Baa Baa Black Sheep.</p> <p>Talk about a sheep's soft coat and ask the child to name other things that feel soft to touch.</p>	<p>Go for a walk with the child and collect things from the park, beach or backyard. Spend time touching each thing and talk about how it feels.</p> <p>Ask the child to make groups of things that are smooth, rough, soft or hard.</p>
<p>3 - My Fancy Gifts</p> 	<p>Put a small chocolate, lolly or apple in a box as a gift to give to somebody. 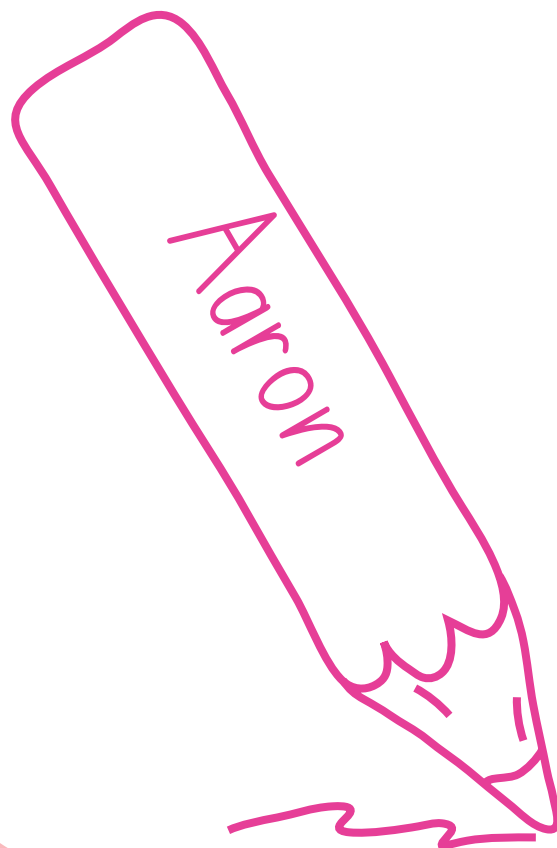

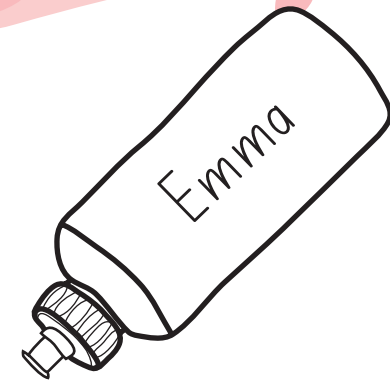
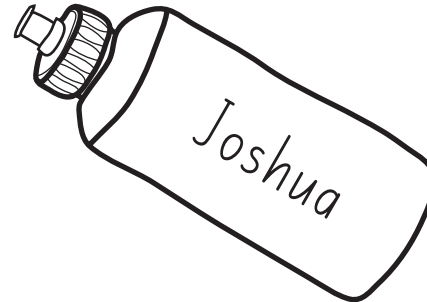
